Dear ,

The Far West Repeater Association - K6FWR is issuing a formal warning to you regarding your use of its repeater system.

This formal warning is being made as a result of you failing to follow operational rules set forth by the licensee/control operators of the K6FWR - Far West Repeater Association repeaters.

You have not complied with repeated requests to cease and desist your inappropriate behavior on the repeater system to include conversations or pronouncements that are by nature, prejudicial, politically or religiously charged, or defamatory toward others and those who may be listening. Specifically, to berate, denounce with hateful intent, or use pejorative language, directed at any social group and or person, for their political, religious, sexual orientation or personal beliefs.

Please be advised that we expect you to abide by this request to immediately cease the behavior mentioned above, or stay off the K6FWR system.

Your failure to comply with the rules of the K6FWR system after receipt of this letter will result in you being banned from the K6FWR repeater system.

If you fail to comply with the ban, your transmissions will be viewed as malicious interference. The FWRA will file a formal complaint with the Federal Communications Commission requesting enforcement action be taken against you for Malicious Interference on the FWRA repeaters. This could ultimately jeopardize your Amateur license.

This problem has a simple solution. Simply comply with the rules. No exceptions.
This is your last chance.
